REFORMATION SUNDAY: ABOUT WORSHIP TODAY

Reformation Sunday remembers the sweeping church reforms and new theological understandings of the 16^{th} century. The hymns today reflect the Reformation movement and some of its leaders, Martin Luther and John Calvin. The paraments on the lectern and pulpit and the ministers' stoles are made from Immanuel's signature tartan, registered in Scotland, as a celebration of the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s roots in the Church of Scotland.

The Nicene Creed was the first (and in fact is the only) creed used ecumenically by the majority of Christians throughout the world.
