Our livestream worship extends our community across the country. Committed to "keeping faith in the city," Immanuel supports the Interchange Food Pantry and is active with Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity and Southeastern Wisconsin Common Ground. Global mission projects reach to Zambia and Cuba. Worship is our first priority and education is emphasized for all ages. STEWARDSHIP for 2023

The stewarding of God's good gifts means taking our place in God's household and in God's world. The Session and the Board of Trustees have unanimously adopted a proposed budget for 2023 that reflects our commitments to mission, staff support, worship, and education as well as the current economic realities of reduced endowment fund income and increased costs. An increase in pledge revenue has been set at 5%.

The pledge goal for 2023 is \$970,662.

As of Wednesday, pledges for \$567,894 have been received.
