THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER THE FIRST SERVICE OF EASTER

March 30, 2024

Half after seven o' clock

Please gather silently in the Great Hall (silence all cell phones and electronic devices).

The Great Vigil of Easter is the brightest jewel of Christian liturgy traced to early Christian times. Traditionally, the East Vigil begins at sunset, in keeping with the ancient Jewish/Christian understanding of evening as the start of a new day. It proclaims the universal significance of God's saving acts in history through the services of light, readings, the Sacrament of Baptism, and the Sacrament of The Lord's Supper:

<u>**The Service of Lights:**</u> The Christ, or "paschal" candle in our midst is a symbol of Christ throughout this service. It reminds us that Christ came as a light shining in darkness.

<u>The Service of Readings</u>: The scriptures from the Old and New Testament provide a panoramic view of what God has done for humanity. The readings retell our "holy history" as God's people, summarizing the faith into which we are baptized.

<u>The Service of Baptism and Reaffirmation of the Baptismal Covenant</u>: In the earliest years of Christianity, baptisms commonly took place during the Easter vigil after the forty day preparation of Lent. Just as water brings both life and death, the waters of the font symbolize that in Baptism we die to sin and are raised to new life. Baptism is most appropriately celebrated and reaffirmed at Easter, uniting believers to Christ's death and resurrection.

The Service of Communion: The final service of the vigil is the joyous celebration of the feast of the people of God. The risen Lord invites us all to participate in the new life he brings by knowing him in the breaking of bread and the sharing of the cup.
